



The timing was 57 seconds for the Saturday evening vigil mass and 1 minute 25 seconds for the Sunday morning mass. It was observed that for both the masses, there were a number of parishioners queuing up at the exits. Remember Fire is not kind, so if one exit is crowded please seek another and evacuate the building the fastest way possible even if it means going to another exit. Also after evacuating the church, it is not social time until you reach the assembly area at the car park. So if you could move swiftly to the assembly area that would make the drill a little more effective. Finally it is a big NO NO to drive out of the car park while parishioners are walking back to the church. That in itself was guite a hazard at both masses.
